Tic-Tac-Toe

Allow your child to choose three 21st Century Learning tasks for the week.

Check them off as you go! See if you can get three in a row! If you are an over-achiever, try to make an X pattern, Square pattern, or "Blackout" by doing them all!

<p>Go on a venture outside. Find 3 things that are moving around. Explain how these things are moving. Is something pushing/pulling on it? Draw a picture in your homework journal of your findings and write about them.</p> <p>(Force & Motion)</p>	<p>Look around your house for things you can make sets of 5. (Ex. 5 spoons, 5 crayons, 5 napkins, etc.) With your family, create a word problem about the objects and write it in your journal. Bring it to school and the class can try to solve it!</p> <p>For example: I have 3 spoons. My mom has 2 spoons. How many spoons do we have all together?</p> <p>(Word Problems)</p>	<p>Go on a Phonics Hunt for objects that begin with the letters "U" and "V," or even products that have these letters written on them (i.e. cereal boxes, magazines). To make it more fun, let your child carry a magnifying glass like a detective!</p> <p>(Phonemic Awareness)</p>
<p>Write a story about someone that is a Hero to you. Ask your family if there is a Veteran in your family, neighbor, or friends. Ask them about their experiences.</p> <p>(Veteran's Day and Narrative Writing)</p>	<p>Collect twenty objects from somewhere in your home.(ex. Lima Beans) See if someone will help you to use shaving cream to show ALL the ways you can show each number from 1-20.</p> <p>(Counts Twenty Objects)</p>	<p>Write a sight word in big letters on one page of your homework journal. Use small pieces (like cheerios or lima beans) to build the word. How many pieces did it take?</p> <p>(Sight Words & Counting)</p>
<p>Count to 100 by tens. Write these numbers on separate cards/pieces of paper (10...20...30...etc.) and put them in order. To start off easier, begin with just counting by 10s to 50.</p> <p>(Counting and Cardinality)</p>	<p>Thanksgiving will soon be here. Draw sets of Turkeys. Cut out the sets and groups of Turkeys. Make < and > signs. Arrange the sets of Turkeys, and use the signs to tell if each set is more or less than the other.</p> <p>(Greater Than and Less Than to Ten)</p>	<p>Go on KidRex.org with a family member and search "Bald Eagle." Research 2-3 new facts about the Bald Eagle and record them in your homework journal.</p> <p>(Digital Literacy & American Symbols)</p>
